Essential Responsibilities:

- Supervise the day to day operations of an Adult Foster Care home
- Assist residents with cleaning, laundry, hygiene, meal prep, and grocery shopping
- Manage the department's finances and operate within the developed budget
- Coordinate medical, dental, and psychiatric care for residents. This may include providing or scheduling transportation
- Provide social and living skills training to residents by following developed goals. This includes communicating regularly with other service providers
- Manage and supervise staff, including hiring, training, and scheduling as well as conducting performance evaluations and providing direct feedback and constructive criticism to staff
- Facilitate monthly staff meetings
- Provide crisis management and de-escalation as needed in the home
- Write treatment plans, abuse prevention plans, and update AFC files
- Follow AFC regulations as outlined in 245D
- Complete daily case notes for each resident
- Promote recovery as the ultimate goal
- Participate in the on call rotation every 4-6 weeks

Credentials/Qualifications:

- Ability to work independently

Work Environment:

The employee in this position typically works the majority of the time in an Adult Foster Care setting. Candidates will be expected to work generally Monday – Friday, daytime hours, with some flexibility based on program needs. The person in this position will work 35-40 hours per week.
